country	A nation with its own government.
continent	A large land mass, usually made up of a group of countries.
compass	A device that shows direction – North, East, South or West.
capital	A city that functions as the seat of the government – usually very well populated.
culture	The ideas, customs and behaviour of a group of people.
Kenya	A country in the continent of Africa.
Maasai tribe	A tribe that lives in Northern, Central and Southern Kenya.
Nairobi	The capital and largest city in Kenya.

Powerful knowledge
