This October we are celebrating Black History Month. The theme for this year is "Standing Firm in Power and Pride", a powerful tribute to the resilience, strength and unwavering commitment to progress that defines the Black Community across the globe.

In school, Black History is an important part of our learning all year round and is intertwined into our curriculum. During this month, each class will be focusing on inspiring people and their stories, from leaders, activists and pioneers who changed the world to people who are dedicated to future continued empowerment, unity and growth.

In EYFS we will be creating art and celebrating African and Caribbean culture. In KS1 and KS2 we will be focusing on people such as Walter Tull, one of the first Black professional footballers and a soldier who showed bravery and Leadership.

Rosa Parks, who stood up for equality by refusing to give up her seat, helping to change civil rights history. Benjamin Zephaniah, a poet and writer who used words to inspire and give voice to others and also Stormzy, a musician and role model who uses his platform to speak out about social issues and support young people to achieve their goals.

Children will also be creating artwork to celebrate inspirational individuals, which will be displayed in school to share with our community. This is a wonderful opportunity for us all to reflect, learn and celebrate together.
