# Year 5 Newsletter

## Our History Topic this half term is the Vikings.

Our enquiry question is:

**What can we learn from the raids and invasions by Vikings in Anglo-Saxon Britain?**

We will be learning about when and where the Vikings came from and why they invaded Britain. We will also be learning about various Anglo-Saxon kings and how successful they were. We will also study how the Vikings shaped Britain.



### You could try:

- Visiting the museums in Leeds to explore History.
- Researching the topic at home using the internet and books. Make sure you share your findings with the class!

## Writing

In writing, we are learning how to write arguments. We have discussed what features effective written arguments use and have developed these skills in lessons. We are building up to pupils answering the following question.

**Would you rather be a superhero or a witch/wizard?**

### You could try:

- Creating a persuasive argument at home about a topic that you want change in. This could be your own life or a wider global issue.

## Maths

In Maths, we will be learning about fractions.

In these lessons, we will be learning about equivalent fractions, mixed numbers, improper fractions and adding fractions with a value greater than one.

We will also continue to boost our times tables recall with weekly practices and tests.

### You could try:

- Practicing Times Tables Rockstars and other Times Tables Games
- Playing on 'Daily 10'. A free game on the top marks website which helps you practice various Mental Maths skills.

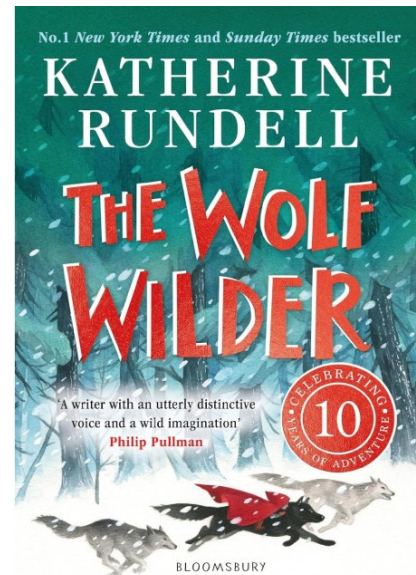
# English Carousel

In year 5, we have been developing our English skills in a daily carousel. This daily rotation of activities means we are able to focus on; handwriting, reading, spelling and punctuation and grammar across the week.

Our class book remains *Wolf Wilder* by Katherine Rundell. The class (and myself included) are gripped by this story and we can't wait to find out where the story is going to take us!

## You could try:

- Creating a story map of our class book so far.
- Write a diary entry as one of the characters.
- Create a new front cover to the book.



## PE

PE days are Monday and Tuesday this year.

This half term, Mr Malley will teach fitness on a Monday. MVMNT will teach dodgeball on a Tuesday.



## Science

We are studying 'Living things and their habitats' this half term. We will be learning about reproduction in both plants and animals. We will also be learning about life cycles and comparing life cycles of amphibians, insects and mammals.



## You could try:

- Research Jane Goodall and create a poster about your findings.
- Plan and conduct your own experiment on plants.

## Homework and Spellings
