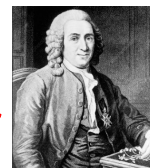

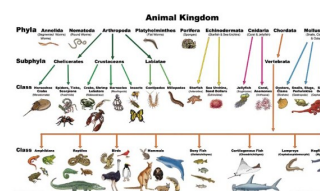
Science

Our new topic this term is

'Living things and their habitats'.



In this topic we will be looking at the classification of living things, including micro-organisms. The children will build on their work in Year 4 by sorting animals into groups based on their similarities and differences. They will then extend their learning to find out about the standard system of classification first developed by Carl Linnaeus, choosing an animal and researching its classification.



English

In English we will be getting ready for SATS by revising many topics we have learnt throughout the year. There will be a focus on SPAG terminology and using these SPAG skills in our writing. In reading, we will be completing a number of practise SATS questions focusing on many different skills including retrieval and inference.

It is essential that the children are reading as much as possible at home to help increase their understanding of vocabulary and also their reading speed.



Maths

This term, we will be revising many Maths topics we have covered this year and that have been covered in years 3,4 and 5. We will focus on:

Number and Place Value

The Four Operations (+ - x divide)

Fractions, Decimals and percentages

Measure (length, mass, capacity, volume, area, perimeter and time)

Statistics

Shape (2D, 3D, angles)

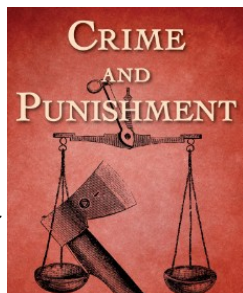


Starbooks!
