<u>Guide to virtual day trips</u> Here you can find a selection of 'virtual day trips' to a variety of places around the globe. I've made an interactive map (below the guide, just scroll down) so you can choose which place to visit and click on the name which will take you straight there. I have also broken down what you can do on the trip below, so grown-ups can make a judgement on whether this will hold their child's interest. I've included plenty of museums for more cultural experiences but also other places too- there is so much out there! Hope this is helpful.

Museums	
The British Museum	Really good, super interactive. A favourite of mine. There's a bit of a long loading time (lots of dots connecting on screen) but don't worry, it will be worth it.  Use the arrows on your keyboard to travel 'through time' stop wherever interests you. Then choose a part of the world (colour coded) to click on a dot- this dot will be an exhibit of an artefact from that time and in that part of the world!  When you click on the dot it will show you the artefact and you can click on audio to hear more if you are interested. It also has written information and a map of where exactly the artefact was from.  If you have a specific interest, you can filter which type of artefacts appear by clicking on your interest in the side bar under the eye (options are Art & Design, Living & Dying, Power & Identity, Religion & Belief, Trade & Conflict).
The Guggenheim, New York	What can you learn?  Cool for children who like art and quirky buildings- this is a street view access so you can 'walk' around the spiral staircase as well as checking out 20+ pieces of art either using the street view navigation or the bar below.  Why don't you try and create some cool modern art?
National Gallery of Art, Washington, D.C.	A bit less interactive than the others, you have to select one of the exhibitions and flick through pictures. Good for people who like more traditional art.  See if you can do old fashioned portraits of your family, or design fashionable outfits like you can see in these exhibits.

All of these museums are walk through- google streetview style.

They vary in content, some have just one room/gallery to 'walk' around (if this is the case, the link takes you straight in). Others have several galleries to look through. If this is the case, the link takes you to a Google 'Arts and Culture' page, you just need to scroll down until you see 'museum views' – click on what interests you!

They might not all interest you, check out the type of museum it is first because if you're more into modern art you would want to visit the National Museum of Modern and Contemporary art. You could even have a go at making your own modern art!

If you prefer sculptures, check out the Ufizi gallery. Try making your own sculptures from salt dough (this is easy to make- you can google it but all you need is flour, water and salt)

Here you can read about several galleries then click on them to view them. This will be great for Year 3 as there is an Egyptian Gallery!

	Where can your exploring take you?
San Diego Zoo	San Diego Zoo has tonnes of live cams that you can watch at any time. They also have some fun pre-recorded footage which is really interesting. Can you choose your favourite animal?
Monterey Bay Aquarium	Monterey Bay Aquarium, like San Diego Zoo have an awesome range of cameras to watch live. It's not only interesting but the jelly cam is super relaxing! See what fish you can spotwhy don't you draw them?
Disney world	That's right! Disney have actually made a 3D walk through, too! And there are several videos so you can enjoy the rides, too. Pair this with a Disney movie in the afternoon and you have a seriously fun day!
Wildlife Trust Badger Cam, Cumbria	So sweet, but you might have to be patient! The wildlife Trust have set up a badger cam- see if you can catch a glimpse of these cheeky creatures in their natural habitat. Try and look in the evening for these nocturnal creatures.

Folly Farm, Pembrokeshire	This lovely little farm has a live webcam in their barn- can you spot the donkeys, goats and sheep? I even spotted a few birds flying around, probably trying to steal some food from the animals. Have a watch and see what you notice at the farm.
