RE: End of Year Reports

Dear Parents and Carers,

All teachers have written their reports for the academic year 2019-2020 and these will be sent to your email address this week. This school year has been far shorter than we would have liked and the strange circumstances surrounding this are ones I'm sure most of us will never forget. Our reports are therefore slightly different this year- there is no pupil comment page and attendance and punctuality figures have been removed. They were written focusing on the children at the point in March which schools closed. We are aware that pupils will likely have made progress in some areas, and perhaps not in others, but we considered statutory guidance and have tried to provide a true reflection of their time in school between September and March.

The report is not a prediction of where we thought the pupils would be had they remained in school for the year. Some subjects will have been covered in more depth than others- for example - some classes may have only covered limited history topics. As most of our curriculum is cross curricular we have based judgements on all areas from the lessons the teachers delivered, and we are mindful these could have been different if an entire topic was devoted to those subjects.

Once the class teacher has sent all reports we will send a text message to inform you they have been sent. Please look out for the notifications and get in touch with school if you do not receive it for any reason. All pupils on our roll will receive a report. All teachers will be also send a set of their reports to the next class teacher along with partaking in virtual transition meetings at the end of this term and again on Monday 7th September to ensure as smooth a transition as possible.

We have put out transition packs (along with the home learning packs) under the bike shelter- these replace the home learning tasks for the last week of term. We ask that pupils complete these packs and either post them back in the stripy post box out on the table- or bring them back into school in September. All work posted in the post box will be quarantined for 3 days before opening. We would like to take this











opportunity to wish our Year 6 pupils moving on to high school this year the very best of luck for the future! You will be missed.

We hope you enjoy reading your report. If you would like to feedback on the report you may reply to the email it has been received from; however, should any follow-up discussion be required that may be arranged for September onwards in line with the DfE guidance.
