Medicines in School

We would just like to remind parents about our Medicine's in School Policy, details of which can be found on the school website.

We are not allowed to administer general pain relief like Calpol or other over the counter medications or anything not prescribed by a doctor.

In the case of antibiotics, we will only administer medicine if it is four times a day dosage, giving the lunchtime dose only. In the case of three times a day dosage we ask that parents administer it themselves in the morning, after school and then at bedtime. This does not affect the effectiveness of the antibiotic as long as the three doses are given through the day and the course is completed.

All medicine must be handed into the school office and a form completed to give authorization and it must be in the original packaging with the child's name on with the prescription details visible. Please do not leave it in your child's bag.
