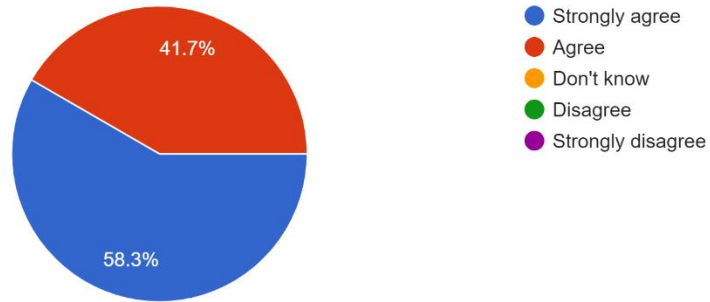

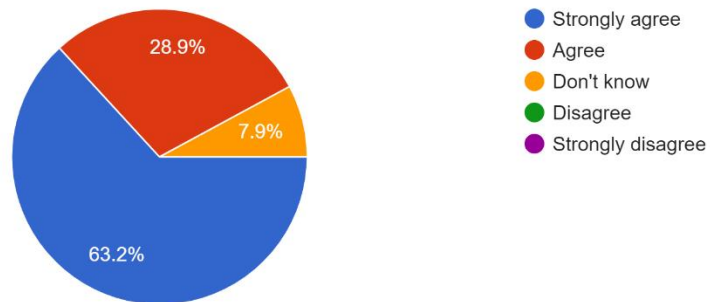
1. My child is happy at this school

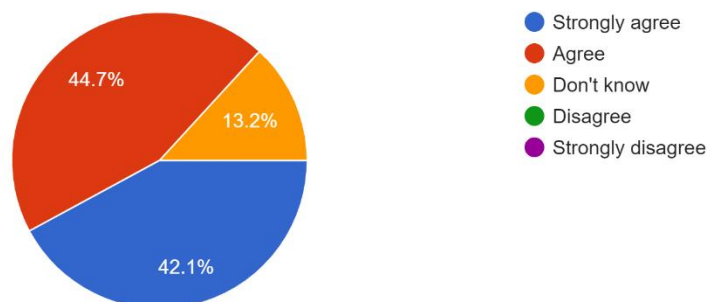
2. My child feels safe at this school

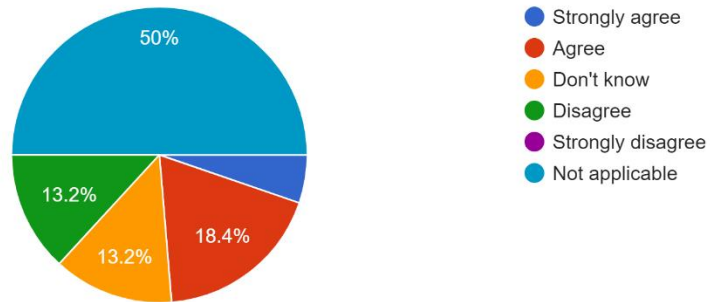


3. The school ensures its pupils are well behaved

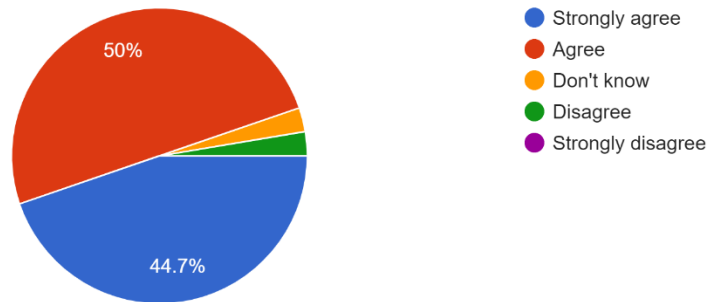

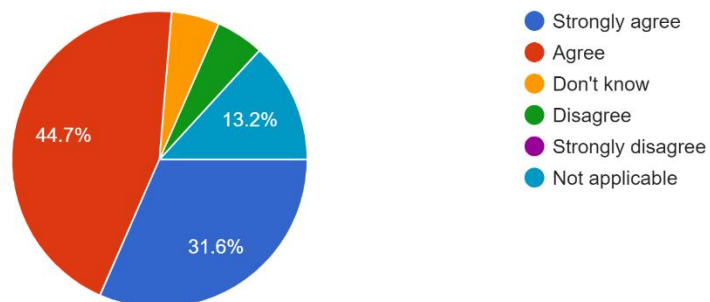
4. My child has been bullied and the school dealt with it quickly and effectively

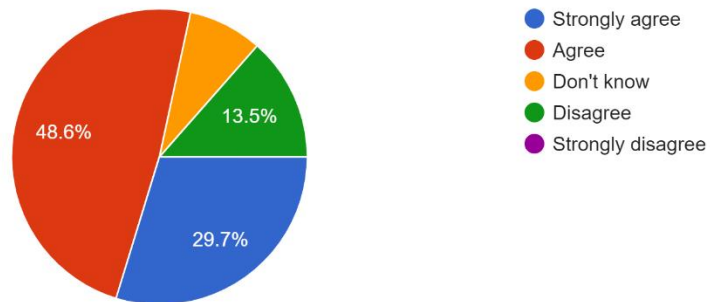


6. When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with properly

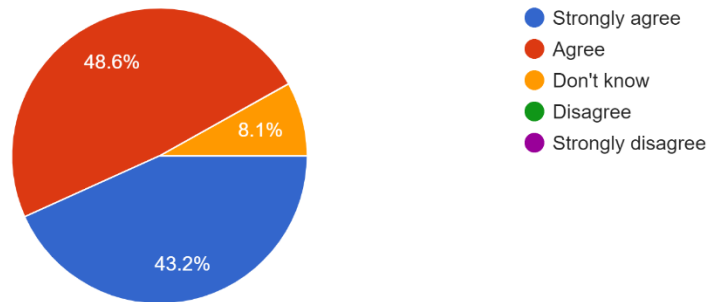
7. The school has high expectations for my child

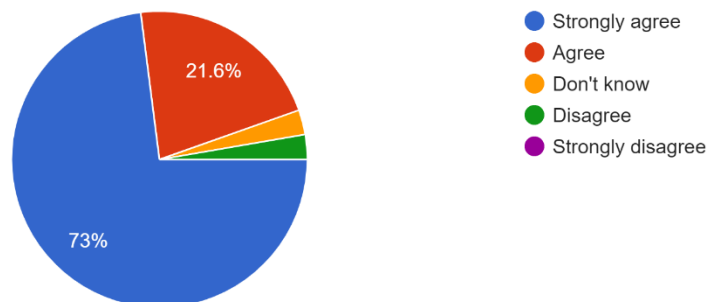
8. There is a good range of subjects available for my child at this school

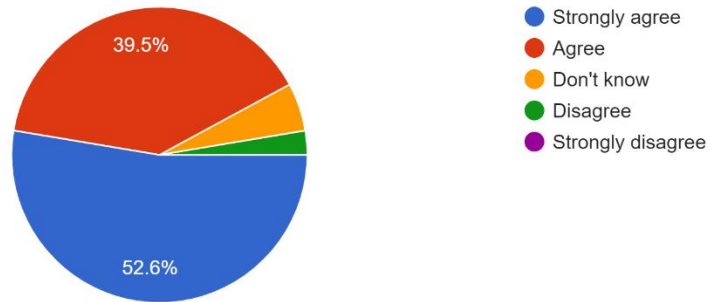
9. My child enjoys taking part in school enrichment activities (e.g. sports & science week)

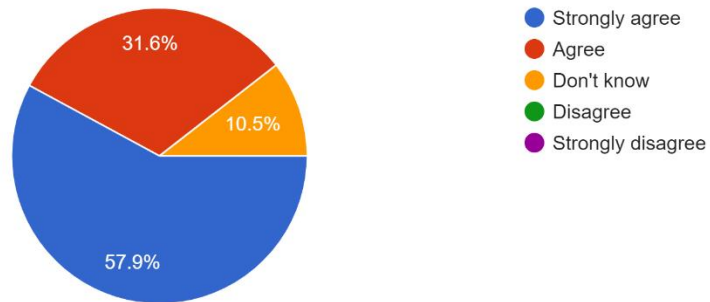
10. The school supports my child's personal development

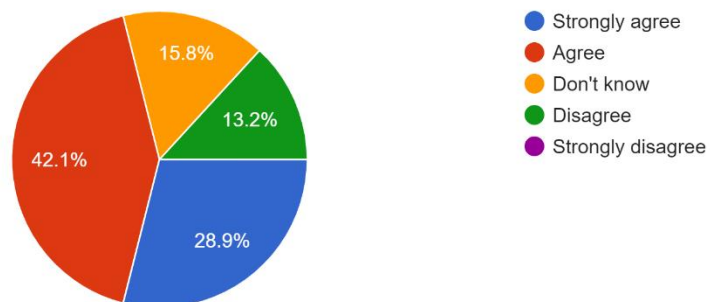
11. I feel that my child is cherished at this school

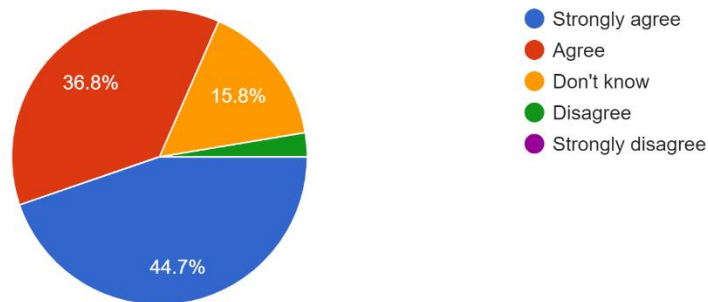
12. I feel that my child is challenged at this school

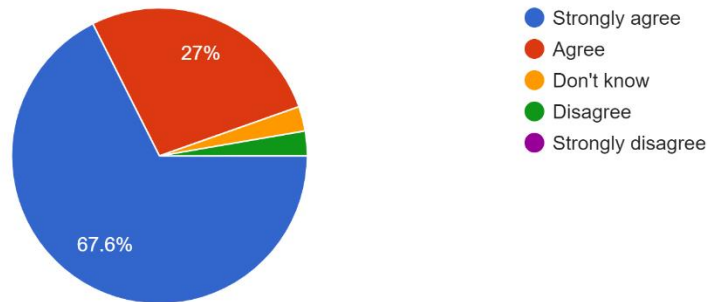
13. My child feels valued and accepted as a Child of God at this school

Friendly atmosphere, good core school values

The staff know the pupil well and make each child feel valued

better communication, i.e. more notice for example only telling parents an hour before the end of the day that there was no sports club.

Not enough facilities/ safe spaces etc for SEN children

It would be great to see more foreign language lessons be included, [REDACTED] really enjoyed these and they seem to have stopped.

Sometimes the quieter children can be overlooked and not encouraged enough.

Also I think there should be better IT facilities as when children have to share computers not all children get enough time on them and I think this is the subject the pupils will be behind pupils from other schools once they get to high school as I don't think enough importance is given to a skill that will be needed for almost every job when they reach adulthood.

More challenging work for children who are able for it.

I think teachers should be more aware of the attitude and behaviour problems within their classes. I observed bullying attitude first hand and did not feel I could intervene, even though it was towards my son, as it happened within the school premises.

Could there be any more scope for community outreach?

Lack of outdoor space but of course that can't be helped due to the nature of the space around school.

- More interesting play equipment in the playground eg climbing frames etc (although realising finances can restrict this!)
- More opportunities for parents to see the children in the school setting/classroom eg. Parent reading sessions or play activities.
- More language learning. It sounds like they may have done a bit in year 3? But it's unclear.
- Taking more of the kids books/work home at the end of the year. Because we haven't been into school this year to see the girls publishing books (we needed to do online parents evenings), it's been a shame not to see more of their school work.

Perhaps streamlining communication so that there aren't so many different apps, it's a lot with communication coming through dojo, class list, school spider and email, as well as parent WhatsApp groups, hard to keep up with it sometimes.
